Remember, the mighty 427 " averaged 300 hp " after an 8 hour duty cycle on the Chris Craft dyno with a low riser intake manifold, flat tappet lifter camshaft, gear drive distributor / points ignition, no knock sensor, carburetor, no EFI & with a restrictive exhaust system. This is not a fair comparison by today's standards

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
